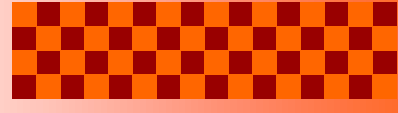
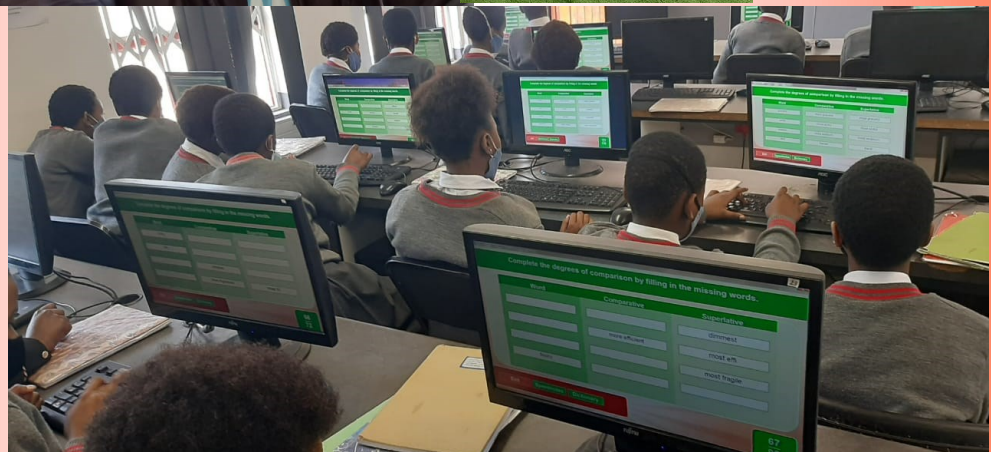

The debating team would like to thank Ms Mbusi for her active rol in coaching our coaching our debating team.



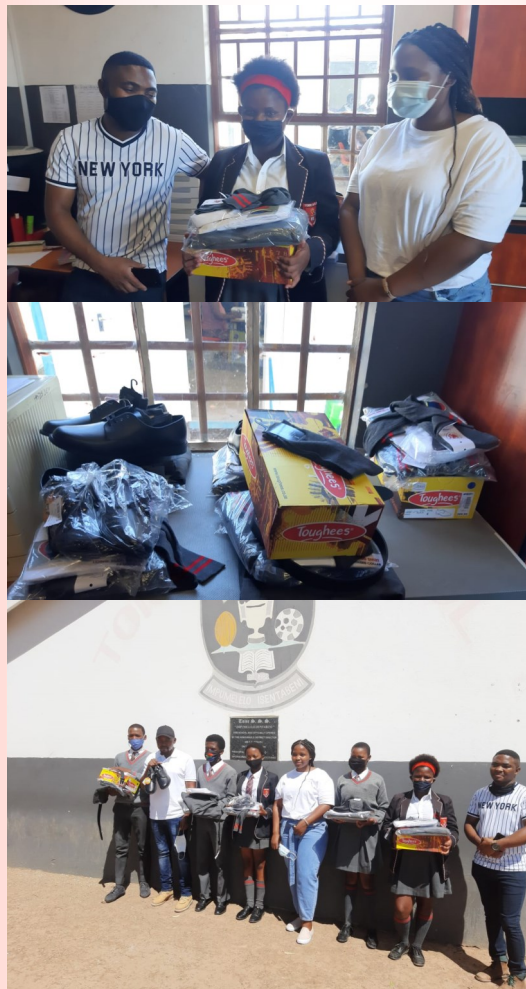
# Helping hand foundation

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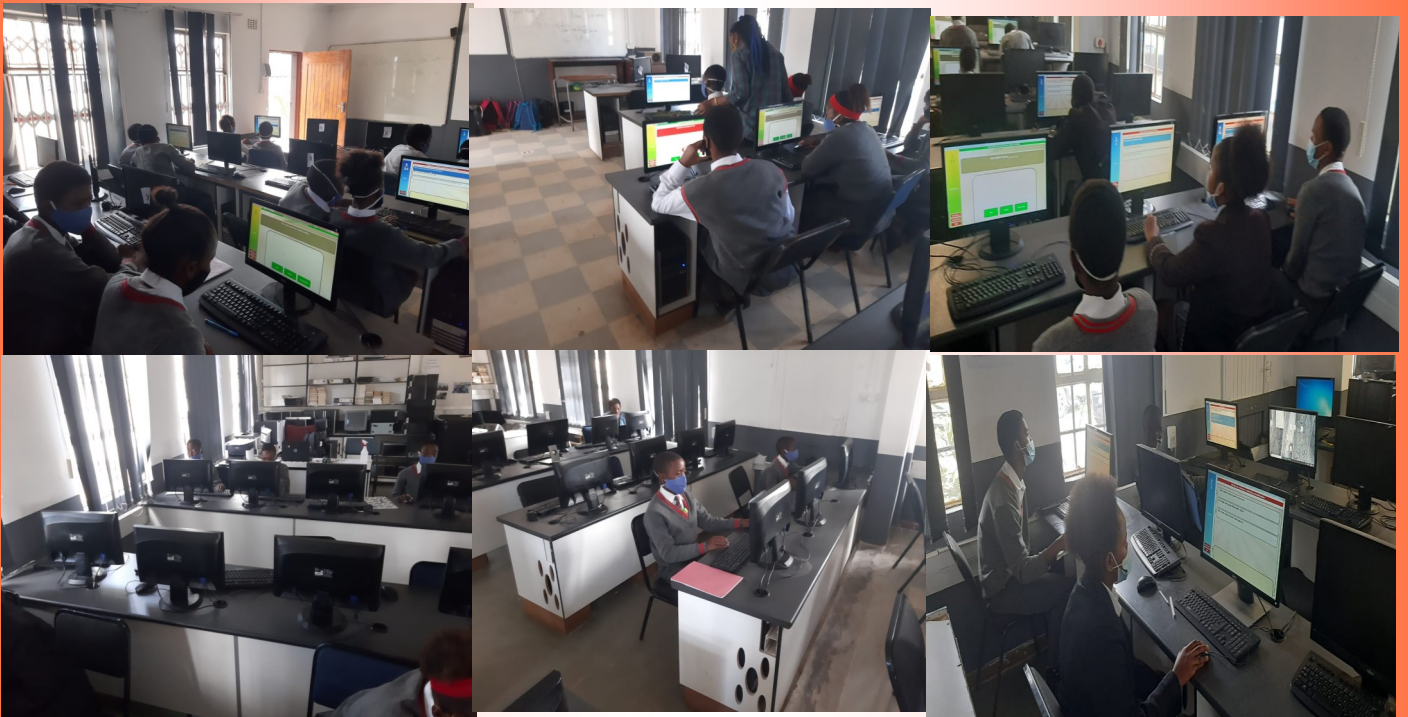


Sifunda Kunye computer lab at our school follows a caps aligned software program Cami. The program helps learners with English and mathematical skills.
